

The reverse of the Fields Medal "Congregati ex toto orbe Mathematici ob scripta insignia tribuere."


["Mathematicians gathered from the entire world have awarded (this prize) for outstanding writings."]


The obverse of the Fields Medal "Transire suum pectus mundoque potiri." ["Rise above oneself and grasp the world."]


68 Medals From 24 Countries (+ 1 Apolide) From 4 Continents











The Second Woman (Helsinki, 2022)



 A silver plaque was given to him during the opening ceremony of the International Congress of Mathematicians of Berlin by the President of the International Mathematical Union who said:


«I'm sorry but this plaque is too narrow to contain your proof of Fermat's Last Theorem».

The Quantum Fields Medal (Kyoto, 1990)


• Witten is a famous theoretical physicist who worked on quantum fields. He is the only non-mathematician to whom was awarded a Fields Medal.
